Dear Sirs

I have received your letter of the 25<sup>th</sup> inst enclosing the other papers — I have written to Antigua for the acct sales from New York & will send them to you when I get them. Mess<sup>rs</sup> Thomson, Hankey & Co must have the acct sales from Antigua for molasses & log wood etc as I forwarded all those I received with the journals & wages sheets which were sent

one during the year 1895. What  
appears to me to be a mistake  
in the acc<sup>ts</sup> is that the Net Profit  
is so called before the attorney's  
commission has been deducted,  
the net profit, (which is what  
I should have to spend otherwise  
than upon anything connected  
with the estates) should be that  
which is left over & above after  
every conceivable outgoing in  
connection with the estates has  
been paid. Would you be good  
enough to let me know what  
you now consider the attorney's  
commission for 1894 at 5. p.c. <sup>5</sup> 72  
should be — is it \$30.17 - 11.

+ As to the insurance premium  
paid annually by Mess<sup>rs</sup> Mashby  
+ Wilde & Co. I will consider how  
this shall be paid in future.

all to make out the account for 1894  
afresh if it is to be done upon the  
lines your letter suggests, as I  
remarked in London - to show a  
profit of £529-19-11 for that year  
is simply showing a false result -

Has the commission for 1893 (orig:  
£156-3-0) been deducted in the  
book from the profit of that year?  
As to the sum of £93-4-0 due from  
Mess<sup>rs</sup> being as surplus of receipts  
over expenditure for 1894 where is  
it shown that they have paid that  
amount to my credit, or that they

have allowed for that amount?  
Mess<sup>rs</sup>: Thomson Hankey & Co  
paid them on their acc<sup>t</sup> for that  
year for one a sum of £31-9-0 <sup>S<sup>d</sup></sup>  
on the 21<sup>st</sup> - May 1895,
