

Dredging.

Cheapness of naphtha as compared with
gasoline considered. Impracticable to
buy naphtha until we can pay cash.

One of Mr. Young's lighters sunk in the
Hillsboro river, so he has been unable to
come for sand as yet. A lighter, sent to
take sand here took shell by mistake, but
could not have taken sand anyway as it
was not rigged right to hold sand. Mr.
Young says that he has to build up the
sand business and will do so as rapidly
as possible.

There may be an opportunity to make
a sand deal with Mr. Bird of St. Petersburg
Ditching Problems.

The best way to manage the ditching
is a real problem. The Executive thinks
that the borrowed Fund should
be used mainly for the larger ditches

and people should be encouraged to do as much as possible for themselves.

We also believe that the large ditches should empty into the river or the bay when possible, to avoid overflow of water in the Inlet, and also to avoid filling it with sand as fast as the dredge can pump it out.

A number of other matters were considered, but left unfinished for lack of time. Store meeting was in session and claimed Mr. Buckley a part of the time.



A communication from J. L. Koenenbacher offering \$300 cash for the unplatted land lying east of his property, providing he could be allowed 3 or 4 weeks in which to get the money, was read and discussed.
