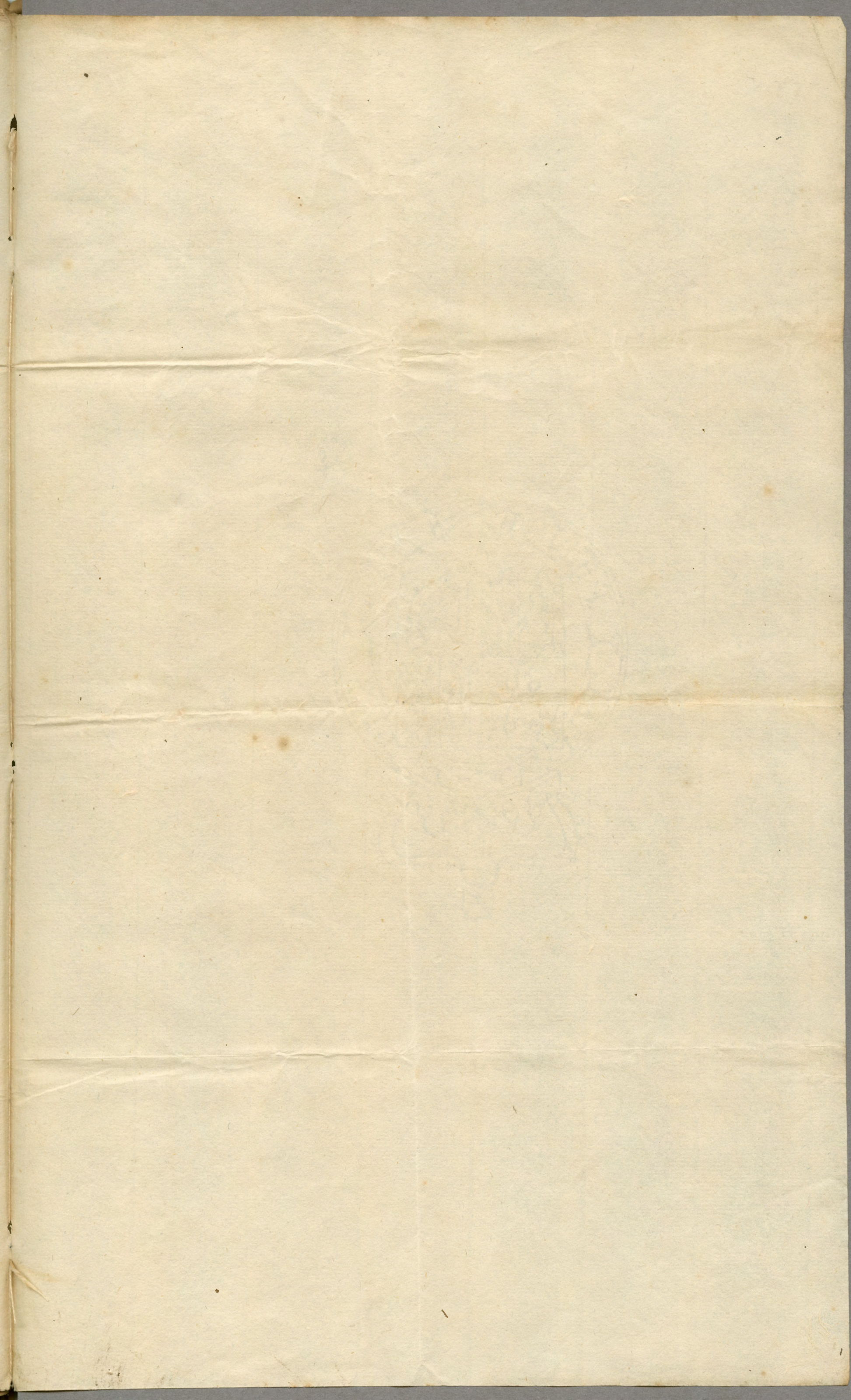
Governour & Councillors Extraordinary assembled; by Petition
I have heard the Just demand of M^{rs}. Simon Delgraff Jun.
Cadet Cornelius Cuvellic & Olivier Oyen, order that the
2/3 parts of the sloop call'd y^e. Peace with her Loading or
Cargoe, & her Apparel, belonging the Owners of the English
Privateer called the Prince of Orange of Bermuda shall
Be sold by Publick Sale to recover all such pretentions as
the Petitioners will proved to have against the Owners of the
a mentioned Privateer of Prince of Orange according of the
Arrest made the 30th. of August 1758. with the Sloop & Boat
Of it, tho the great proceeds of y^e. said sloop & Loading shall
Be sequestered here till the said or the above mentioned
Petitioners shall have proved their pretentions against the
above mentioned Owners of the Privateer & Afterwards
shall be disposed of the money proceeds of the sale of said
sloop & Loading of

Thus Conclude by Governour & Councillors
in the Town of Philipsburg in the Island of St.
Martine the 17th. day of November 1758. in absence
of M^r. Jⁿ. Salomons
