

Alexander Oct 5th 1862

Dear Father

I little think how
long it will be before I can write again than
this is the second time I have been on
guard since we left Roma. It is a very
pleasant day it rained last night
which makes the air cool and the
Sun shines warm. I havent much
of any news to tell you the reason being
I have finished writing on Artillery for
the present so I have to do duty again
Last night Gen Burnside was here and inspected
the charge of mortars the first they find the
Keppler made one with a solid shot and
one it shall it takes two pounds to a
charge. But if it would cost too much
for expense I would like to have you send
me a boy of things some apples some
butter and cheese if you can keep a loaf or
two of bread and anything you can manage

for anything from home would be
very acceptable, & will a number of
the boys have rec'd a box from home.
The Clavigill people have got up a box
for the boys from there and it is on its
way now. I havent got them gathered yet,
and I want you to send a receipt on
them so if they are lost the Rail Road
Co. will have no pay for them and if you
send a box or any thing else send a receipt
I wrote to you in my last letter that
I would like to ^{have} you send me 10 dollars
I have rec'd ^{just} one answer yet. I havent been
relaxed from guard, it is three o'clock
I went out at one we have two hours on
and then off there are three letters 1st 2nd & 3rd
I am in the third. I send a letter that
I will rec'd from John Bobb which I
want you to put in my desk in my room
read it if you want to. I havent rec'd
any papers from home yet have you sent
any off? I dont think having more at
present give my love to all with

seen and tell me all the news
How does the C C Band get along
who have they got for Charley
Cathlin and my place.
