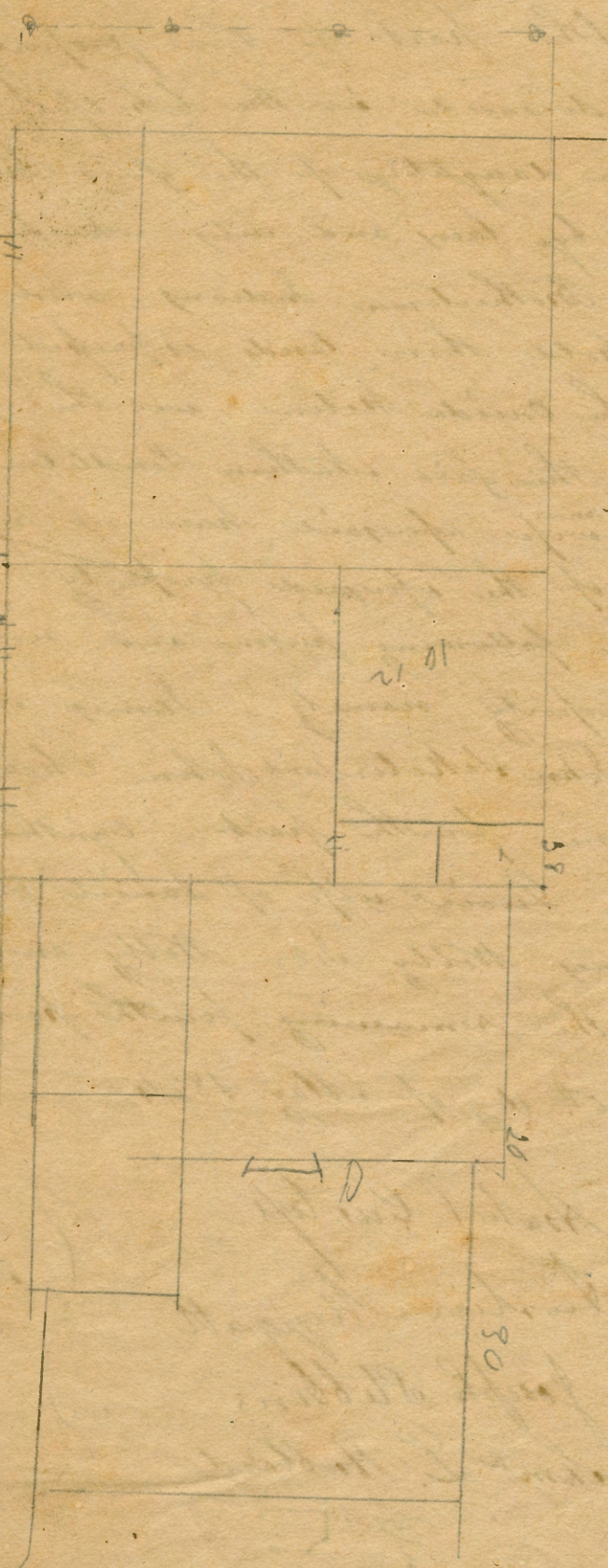


Came before the Superintendants of the Brothertown  
Indians Nathan Pendleton a Mohatto man and  
claimed <sup>for his children</sup> one fifth part of the property lately owned  
by James Niles deceased in the behalf of his former  
wife who was a daughter of the said James Niles

Agreeably to the bye laws and rules which have long  
been among the Brothertown Indians, and the terms  
on which they hold their lands expressed in the deed  
of gift from the Onida Nation we the Superintendants  
do decide that the said Nathan Pendleton or any of the  
children of his <sup>former</sup> wife aforesaid have no right title or  
interest to any of the aforesaid property - and we further  
decide that the following persons and no others are lawful  
heirs to said property namely James Niles Lucy  
Seketer (wife of John Seketer) and John Charley are enti-  
tled each to one fourth part Cynthia wife of  
Thomas Dick Sen. Lucia wife of Daniel Dick Isaac  
Wobby James James Wobby John Wobby and Silas Wobby  
are entitled to the remaining fourth part - Done at  
Brothertown this 20<sup>th</sup> day of May 1824
