

An Account of the Quantity of Sugar made, on the Joint Estates, of Sir George Douglas Bar: Robert Farquhar, in the Island of Antigua, for the last Ten Years, viz: from the Year 1805, to 1814, both Years inclusive: The former consists of about 510 Acres, in the whole, of which there are about 220 Acres of Cane Land & about 209 Negroes of all descriptions, a considerable proportion of whom, are Children, or Old & Superannuated. — The latter consists, of about 300 Acres, of which there are about 110 Acres, of Cane Land, & about 164 Negroes, of whom there is also, a proportion of superannuated Negroes & young Children, In the whole about 373 Negroes, by the last returns of both Estates, have been worked & carried on, as one Plantation, for the last 56 Years, since it has been in the Possession of Mr Farquhar, and his Family. It is to be observed, that the quantity of Land, is only stated from Memory & may not be accurate, but the Number of Negroes & Quantity of Sugar made, is the exact Number & Quantity. —
