Gentlemen I am favored with y<sup>r</sup> Letter of the 12<sup>th</sup> Inst. announcing  
the arrival of a Purchaser of Rum consigned to me from Lord Romney  
On reference to my Acct. of the Estate let to his Lordship, I find that y<sup>r</sup>  
last payment of Rum was up to March. 1814 consequently that two  
Purchasers will be due at March. now ensuing 1818— having  
enough of the Purchaser retained out of the quantity sent by the  
Julius Capt Anthon to March. 1814— which tho' chiefly indifferent  
on hand— I will trouble you to order the Sale of that now arrived  
and I will wait for the rest for my own consumption—  
trusting it will be equally good— with the one now sent—

A few days will terminate the Connection that has so long  
subsisted between Lord Romney's family & mine, is a matter of  
regret to me, but the fault has not been mine— I made  
his Lordship the first offer of a renewal of the Lease & even said that  
I might be induced by a liberal Overture to sell it— Besides  
y<sup>e</sup> he offered me worse terms than the Estate has been let for  
before the last Lease was granted and some thousand pounds  
in the Purchase less than its ascertained Value w<sup>ch</sup> I expect I demand
