Sir

Upon receipt of your Letter of the 13th Instant, I have look'd into the Papers transmitted to me with your Letter of the 7th of October 1726, relating, among other things, to Appeals in Jamaica; All which, according to the desire of the Court of Directors of the South Sea Company, I laid before my Lords Commissioners for Trade & Plantations, And their Lordships having had a Conference with some of the Directors, And made a Report upon the whole to His late Majesty, I do not find that I return'd you any Answer in Writing, or that it seem'd necessary so to do, after what pass'd between the Board & the Directors on that Subject.
