Sept 5<sup>th</sup>/64

Dear Parents.

I rec'd yours  
of the 2<sup>d</sup> this morning &  
was glad to learn that  
all were still in ~~not~~ usual health.  
As for my health it is also  
very good. I rec'd the Copy Book  
the 2<sup>d</sup> and am very much obliged  
to you for it. I have written  
in it some but not enough  
to get my hand in. It is  
rather difficult for me too,  
as I have been out of practice  
so long. I have just finished  
my forenoon work. Just 12 o'clock  
this forenoon we had to cook  
tomatoes boiled pork & beans for  
dinner and mush for breakfast  
tomorrow morning. I am rather  
hard up for news of importance

to write. The weather as usual  
is warm and pleasant. Ten  
or fifteen of the last 300 that  
came here have died. Those I  
spoke of in Addie's last letter  
Where are Mr. Burton & Oscar  
Dayton, I promised to write  
to them when they were home  
last fall but have neglected  
to do so therefore I know  
nothing of their whereabouts.  
Has Geo Mannering & Charley  
Sumner got mustered out  
of the N.Y. Service yet? if  
they havent I should think  
they soon would be as they  
did not reenlist. My Descrip-  
tive list has come and I  
expect to draw some clothes  
next Saturday. I have not  
drawn a stitch of Uncle Sam's  
clothing in fourteen months.  
therefore I had ought to have  
at least \$50.00 coming to me

on my clothing account.  
But it is good and I shall  
get it if I live to get mustered  
out if I dont before. By the  
way how do you think (providing  
I should stay here until my  
time is out) it would sound  
to have it said that I had  
been three years in the Army,  
and had never been in a  
battle, And only eleven months  
with the Regt. I'm afraid if  
I should happen to be in  
company with one of the boys  
of my Regt, that had endured  
all the hardships with the Regt  
and should throw that in my  
face, I should want to do as  
a hen does when she is in  
danger, (hide my head) But no  
matter, Somebody has got to do  
the work that I do and no cripple  
or sick man can do it, for  
there is a good deal of heavy

lifting to do such as lifting  
boilers of water and soup off  
~~that hold~~ and on to a range  
that is three feet high, and the  
boilers hold from one to two  
barrels each. Besides a great deal  
of other work that none but a  
well man can do. And I dont  
see why that man can as well  
be me as anybody else. You say  
you hope Old Abe will be  
reelected, Well I dont hot that  
I have any thing in particular  
against Old Abe, but I think  
a change of Presidents would  
be beneficial. And I would like  
to have you prove to me in  
what respect McClellan acted  
the part of a traitor. The  
majority of the last squad that  
came here has never so little  
Army of the Potowmack. I recollect  
there was a report at the time  
he was superseded that he was  
never at the front during a battle  
But that is contradicted by every  
soldier that I have heard say any-  
thing about it; that was with  
him in the Paninsular Cam-  
paign. That he was always on hand
