heirs heirs therein mentioned doth demise grant and to farme lett unto the said  
Henry Burrell All that his Plantation of Mamor of King fields in the said Island  
of St Christopher with the appurtenances and Negro Slaves therein mentioned  
do hold the Sherey Demisee promised unto the said Henry Burrell his  
Executors Administrators and Assigns from the Twenty fifteth Day of July  
last past before the date hereof for the term of fifteen years from  
the next ensuing Day next yearly unto the said Christopher Bassepoen  
his Heirs or Assigns the yearly Rent of one hundred and twenty Pounds  
of good and lawfully money of England on the Twenty fifteth Day of July in  
every year in the Common Dining Hall of the Middle Temple London If  
therefore the above bounden Henry Burrell and John M<sup>r</sup> Arthur

or any of them their or any of  
their Heirs Executors or Administrators or any of them do and shall  
yearly and every year during the said term of fifteen years on the  
Twenty fifteth Day of July in every year well and truly pay or cause to  
be paid unto the above named Christopher Bassepoen his Executors  
Administrators or Assigns in the said Dining Hall of the Middle Temple  
London the said yearly sum of one hundred and twenty Pounds of good and  
lawfull money of England and also shall and will do make perform  
and keep all and singular the payments Covenants Articles and things  
contained in the said written Indenture of lease Herein this obligation  
to be void and of none effect or else to be and remain in full force  
and virtue.

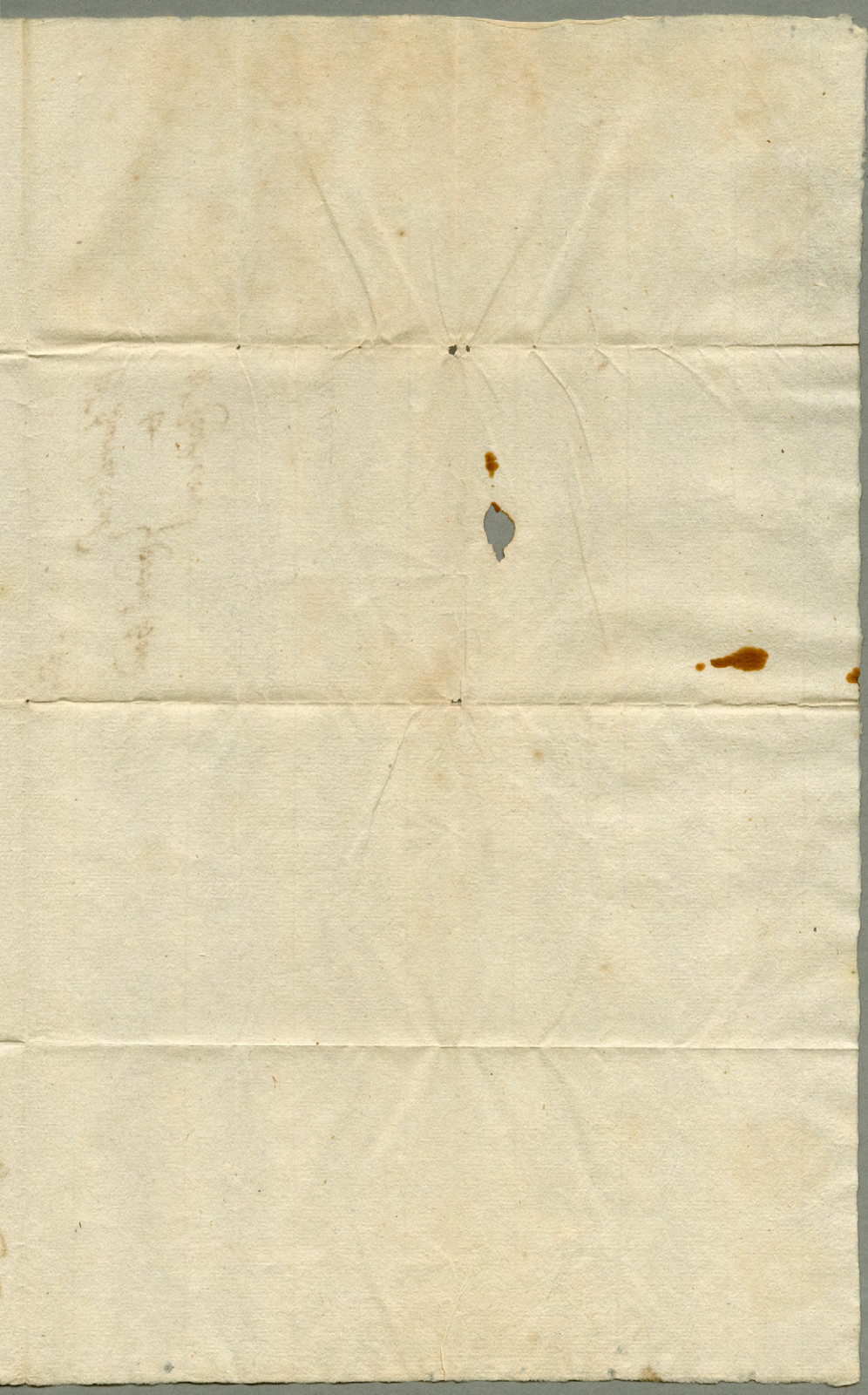
