

CANDIDATES for the Freshman Class, must be able to construe and parse any portion of Virgil, (or instead of Virgil, Cæsar's Commentaries, and Sallust's History,) Cicero's Select Orations, and the Greek Testament, as far as the Acts of the Apostles; the prose part of Graeca Minora, (or instead of Graeca Minora, Jacob's Greek Reader,) and be well acquainted with Clarke's Introduction to making Latin, and Arithmetic as contained in Pike's system, as far as the Roots.
