 I sit down to write a
 few lines to you to let
 you see that I am well
 and hope that these few
 lines will find you the
 same. We stay here
 at Washington yet but
 expect to move every day
 and have bin for the last
 six weeks. The weather has bin
 very stormy here for the last
 to an three weeks it has
 bin rain mostly to day
 it is quite warm and
 pleasant the sun shines
 all most as warm as summer
 I have bin looking
 for a letter for some time
 from you

But I dont get it
i hav wrote to letters
to you before this and
hav not had any answe
from you yet i dont see
what is the reason i havnt
had any letters from you
in fore or five weeks
I got one from Kate
the 27 of January she wrote
that our folks was well
and that she was to work
for Dr Eldrig at Slaterville
I havnt got much news
to write this time Harrison
is well and in good
health but as for Alfred
he never was in as good
health as I am now
nor do I think that i ever
was as fleshey as I am now
so I cant think of much

only the fight goes on
about as usual the rebels
gen. Johnson has sent it
in a flag of truce
to gen. Sherman the 3rd of
day of February I don't
know what it will
amount to yet

We are anxious to make
arrangements to organize them We
have got men enough to
sweep them clean if the
officers would let them
go they would do it too
I must close this for this
time so good buy
