

This Mutual agreement made this twentieth day of December A.D. 1819. Between John Serjeant junr and of the Stockbridge Tribe of Indians: Witnesseth that the D<sup>o</sup> Indians in order to substantiate their claims to the lands at White River in the State of Indiana being it necessary to send a deputation to the General Government of the United States and for the assistance & services of D<sup>o</sup> John Serjeant junr whom we appoint as our Agent to further our wishes in the accomplishment of the design above mentioned we do promise and agree to and with the D<sup>o</sup> John Serjeant junr that whenever our Nation shall Treat with the Government of the State of New York for the sale of our lands at New Stockbridge will give him the said John Serjeant junr five hundred acres of land in N<sup>o</sup> Stockbridge which shall form one Article in any such Treaty: and the D<sup>o</sup> John Serjeant junr agrees to pay the same price for the same as <sup>shall be</sup> ~~is~~ allowed us by the laws for such other lands as we shall dispose of in N<sup>o</sup> Treaty. — Provided however & it is further agreed that if in case the failure of the above mentioned design then & in such a case, this shall forthwith be null and void: — In witness whereof we have hereunto set our hands the day & year first above written —
