and Staves Shingles at 22^s for Cash if I am not disputed
with I hope I shall not be for I have sold to the best
man in the Colon and expect to receive my pay for the
greatest part sold Caution however Dear Sir I never
had so much trouble in delivering a Cargo in my life
Running from Bay to Bay and came as Dear Sir
The Ship in Kings Bay as a person could and safe her
I was seven day trier to get out before I could ~~visit~~ but
Thank God the old Ship is still afloat and Dear Sir
was she fit to load with Sugar I should be loaded
amidst but she is open from her bands then as
a great many Incestres had spots appears now in
you and I never saw that is terrible rotten and the
people have told all about the Cage of the Ship and
her defects with is a honest damage brought to the
value of her or a great deal with standen if I can get
Carpenters to Cork and Repair her and I can only
persuade the Mat and people to stick by the Ship
I do not but I should fail a great deal for hear is not
one Ship in the Colon but my self and the
precent and all the Gentlemen in the Colon will in
cases are a full part if the Ship can only be made strong
but Sir the mat is not a friend to the ones for
a person that I trust him to be and has told me
the people determine to try to get away on the
Ship and that she was not fit to go to sea with I
do must be a plan of his one but I shall prevent
a thing of that kind if I be bound
This is a terrible place to get a letter from but I am
in hopes to have an opportunity to inform you fully of my
determination in a short time with I am not able
to do at present for I have to make the Ship
