My Lord

In Charles Bouley's letter of the 19<sup>th</sup> of June has stated to Your Lordship that he considered the conduct of Mr G. J. Lamphire had rendered him unworthy of the promotion which Your Lordship had intended for him, and acting upon his opinion I have passed him over in the promotion which has since taken place.

Some time ago that Gentleman called on me blamming himself for the destruction of his hopes and fearing he could not possibly recover the ground he had lost. I replied that if any Captain of an active ship would receive him and speak favourably of him at the end of six months I would promise to recommend his case to Your Lordship and to request he might resume his place in the Merchant Service upon


upon Your Lordships' list, Gilpin has
