My Lord

His Charles Ponby's letter of the
19th of April has stated to your Lordship
that he considered the conduct of Mr
G. S. Lamphere had rendered him unworthy
of the promotion which your Lordship had
intended for him, and acting upon this
opinion I have signed him over in the promotion
which has since taken place

Some time ago that Gentleman called
on me blaming himself for the destruction
of his hopes and fearing he could not fully
recover the ground he had lost, I replied
that if any Captain of an active ship would
receive him and speak favourably of him
at the end of six months I would promise
to represent his case to your Lordship and
to request he might resume his place
So I beg to be recommended

Lord Viscount Melville &c.

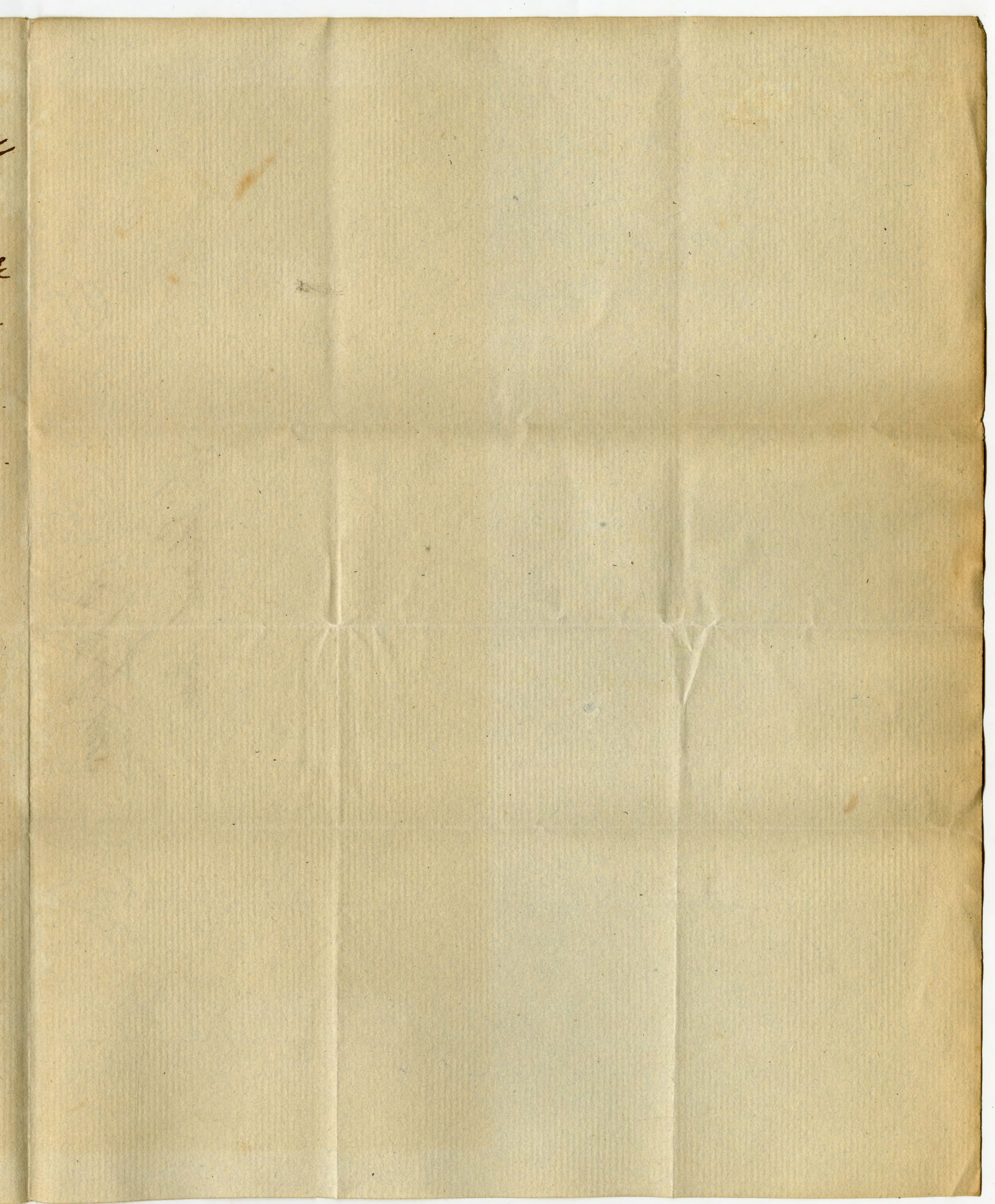
upon Your Lordship's list, Belinda is
