

I have been favored wth a ^{note} ^{of} ^{the} ²⁴ ^{inst} to inform me that
Messrs. Drummer & Co. have only received directions from
them to pay to my account 550 £ in the room of 600 £ due - w^{ch} I presume occurred in
consequence of a promise made to his Ex^{ty} my late Tenant to remit him one
hundred Pounds of his Rent for the year 1822 w^{ch} was accordingly done - but it
was never in my contemplation to continue to do so beyond that period
& as he has stated so to him - Besides as West India Produce has I am told been
scarcely on the advance I conceived Messrs. Drummer & Co. did not expect a
similar deduction, otherwise they w^{ld} have inf^d my letter expressing of
their expectations. As it is they must now pay the 600 £ and in the
next half year upon application - I will take their claim into consideration
