Upon the Receipt of your Packet this day I proceeded to Cambridge
I proceeded to Cambridge immediately to get the Letter of attorney duly executed with all
formality by the Mayor of that Corporation as desired but he being absent from Town caused

day Coach with orders for immediate delivery & I flatter myself you will receive

Postscript you desired - time not permitting me to write it over again, I am not
astonished at Mess^{rs} Derrisbourns refusal to pay Mr Wilmans bill and will provide
for it accordingly trusting that when opportunity offers - You will proceed against
them as the Guaranties of Fyson without either scruple or delicacy -
Fyson's & Lord Romneys Letters were received in your Packet above
mentioned - I flatter myself you will give amongst your other directions to
Mr Woodley one that he will affix a Schedule of my Property with its Value at the
time of signing the lease to prevent disputes relative thereto - to my Successor -
